

Fairfax County Assistance Programs

Northern Virginia Family Service (NVFS) is a non-profit that offers housing services to those experiencing difficulties in areas such as housing, health, and early childhood development. **(571) 748-2500 | nvfs.org**

Bridging Affordability is a program that provides case management and supportive services like job training and financial education, depending on client needs, as well as rental assistance for up to 24 months.

Short-term Rental Assistance Program can offer rent/security deposit assistance. Clients must call intake line directly to learn if they are eligible.

NVFS Family Homeless Shelter in Manassas offers beds for families in need while providing a case manager who can help connect guests with resources and tools to help achieve self-sufficiency.

Cornerstones is a non-profit that aids those in need of food, shelter, affordable housing, quality childcare, and other human services. Cornerstones can help in eviction and foreclosure prevention to homeowners in the Herndon, Reston, Chantilly, and Centreville areas. **(571) 323-9555 | cornerstonesva.org**

Embry Rucker Community Shelter (ERCS) is a 70-bed residential shelter that provides healthy, safe, emergency housing for individuals and families. ERCS is located at 11975 Bowman Towne Drive Reston, VA 20190. **(703) 437-1975**

Coordinated Services Planning (CSP) connects Fairfax County residents to county- and community-based services, including emergency food, shelter, clothing, healthcare, employment, financial assistance, and other essential needs. Specialists operate in a call-center environment and are ready to help you through an assessment to identify the needs you have and link you to resources for which you are eligible. **(703) 222-0880**

Apartments Budgeting Counseling (ABC) Program helps low-income families and individuals by providing affordable housing as well as case management services.

Emergency Services Program can provide cash grants to help prevent evictions, energy service disconnections, first month's rent, and security deposits. Eligible clients must live within these zip codes: 22303, 22306, 22307, 22308, 22309, 22310, 22315, 22060, and 22079. **NOTE: GSH only accepts Emergency Services referrals through Fairfax County's Coordinated Services Planning.**
